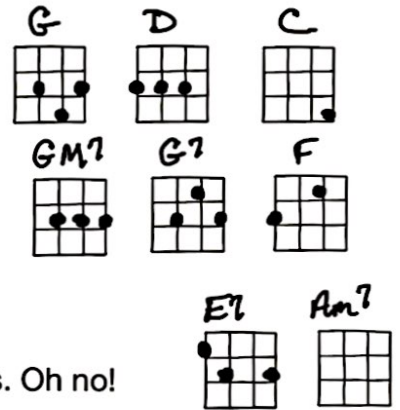
# Everlasting Fruitcake
