Everlasting Fruitcake

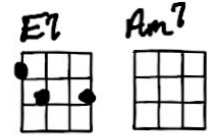
A dessert has come to ^Gour ^Dfam'ly. A fruitcake with resolve to stay. ^G

We figured it must be resistant. Its toughness must be pretty great. ^G ^D ^G

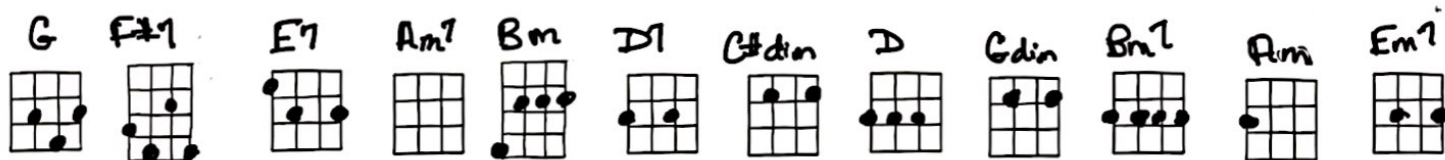
So we turned it into a football that doubles as a paperweight. ^C ^D ^G
